1 How to Read This Report — Methodology

Where the data comes from. StudyFits maintains a verified catalog of universities and programs. Every tuition figure, deadline and language requirement in this report was checked against our catalog on **8 July 2026**; catalog entries are researched directly from official university admission pages and re-verified on a rolling schedule. When a recommendation falls outside our catalog, we research it on the official source and cite the URL and access date next to the figure — in this report, **all 9 recommendations come from the verified StudyFits catalog** (marked StudyFits Partner Catalog ✓).

Catalog-first scope. As agreed before purchase, our recommendations draw primarily on the StudyFits verified catalog, which currently focuses on Poland plus selected institutions elsewhere. The catalog grows continuously; this focus is a feature, not a limitation — it means every number below was verified by a human-supervised research process, not scraped.

The 3×3 matrix. We classify 9 programs into three tiers of three:

- **AMBITIOUS** — stronger academic bar, formal deadlines/entrance steps, higher demand or price at the top of your budget. Worth the effort; admission is not assured.
- **MATCH** — your profile sits comfortably within the typical admitted range and the cost fits your budget cleanly.
- **SAFETY** — rolling, first-come-first-served private admission with entry requirements you already clearly meet, priced below your budget.

Currency note. Some universities bill in Polish zloty (PLN). Where we show a euro equivalent for a PLN price, we use an approximate rate of 1 EUR ≈ 4.25 PLN, marked with "≈". The binding price is always the one in the university's billing currency.

What this report is not. It is not an admission guarantee (see the Legal Notice on the last page) and not a visa consultancy. It is a research-grade decision map: what to apply to, in what order, at what cost, by when.

Student visa	Turkish citizens apply for a national long-stay type D visa at the Polish consulate, then a temporary residence permit for stays over 90 days. Living estimates use €650–750/month for Warsaw and €600–700/month elsewhere with shared housing, $\times 10$ months; add one-off arrival costs (deposit, insurance, adaptation fees $\approx$ €150–400). Scholarship note: your “nice to have” scholarship preference is realistic only after year 1 (merit-based), so plan year 1 fully self-funded.

Budget verdict: Even your Ambitious tier is financeable. If minimising cost is the priority, the Wrocław trio (DSW + WSB + UWr) offers the best price-to-quality spread in one city — one visa file, one housing search, three outcomes.

6 Application Roadmap & Timeline — countdown to 1 October 2026

NOW → 14 Jul	Decision week. Book an online B2 English exam immediately (see §7 — results in days, accepted widely). If CDV Poznań appeals, complete its early-bird enrolment by 14 July (fee waived + €132/yr saved).
By 20 Jul	Prepare the document core every university needs: high-school diploma + transcript, apostille from the Turkish authorities, sworn English translations , passport validity ≥ 18 months, biometric photos.
Late Jul	Sit the B2 exam. In parallel, reserve places at DSW and one WSB campus (both allow registration before documents are complete) and submit PJAIT + SWPS applications — first-come queues reward speed.
By 10 Aug	Submit the University of Wrocław application (hard deadline 31 Aug — don't ride it; visa timing is the real constraint). Target: 2–3 admission letters in hand by mid-August .
Mid Aug	Book the earliest Polish consulate appointment; file the type D visa with admission letter, insurance, proof of funds, accommodation. Processing 15–60 days → this keeps you safe for October.
Sep	Pay the first tuition instalment of your chosen university (UWr by 18 Sep; WSB Wrocław by 30 Sep; SWPS 1st instalment 5 Oct). Arrange housing (university dorm or shared flat), book travel.
1 Oct 2026	Academic year begins. Register locally, activate student status, verify your work-rights situation with the university (§4).

Critical path = English certificate → admission letter → visa appointment. Every week of delay in July compresses your visa window in August–September. Nothing else in this plan is time-critical before the certificate.

7 Advisor's Commentary

Apply in two waves, keep one anchor. Wave 1 (this month): PJAiT + SWPS (ambitious, demand-driven queues) and DSW as your anchor safety — its reserve-now flow means that whatever happens, you start in October. Wave 2 (by 10 August): University of Wrocław for the public-university brand, plus WSB Wrocław or Poznań as the cost-optimal match. That is five applications, roughly €50–65 in total application fees — cheap insurance for a four-year decision.

Why we lean Wrocław. Three of your nine options sit there across all three tiers, the city's IT employment market is strong, and its living costs fit your band with shared housing. Applying to all three converts one city choice into three chances.

Your English certificate is the whole game in July. You self-assess at B2 — good, but every program requires proof. The fastest recognised route from Türkiye is an online proctored exam; **LanguageCert** (online, results typically within days) is available through StudyFits: [LanguageCert — exam options](#). If the exam shows you below B2, PJAiT's one-year **Course Zero** foundation (13,000 PLN, no certificate needed at entry, interview-based) is a respectable plan-B that feeds directly into PJAiT degrees the following year.

Practical money setup. For paying fees in PLN/EUR from Türkiye and living-cost transfers, a multi-currency account saves real money on each instalment: [Wise](#) or [Revolut](#).

One honest caveat. “Rolling admission” sounds relaxed; it is the opposite. Private Polish universities close EN programs when seats fill, quietly and without a published date. In our experience the students who lose their October start are almost never rejected — they are late.
